NCEA Level 2 English (201)

This course is made up of six achievement standards, producing 24 credits, 12 are internal and 12 by external exam at the end of the year.

There is one optional standard – Connections - which will be dependent on time constraints throughout the year

There are THREE compulsory internally assessed achievement standards adding up to 12 credits: 2.4, 2.5, 2.10

During the year there will be ONE resubmission opportunity to be assessed for all standards, if the student is very close to achieving the standard. Feedback will be given at the time of the exercise and candidates are urged to take advantage of this.

There are THREE externally assessed achievement standards: 2.1, 2.2, 2.3 - Students will choose a maximum of 2

To advance to Level 3, a student must achieve 12 credits in the external exam

OR 14 credits overall, including – one standard in the external exam. All standards except 2.5, 2.6, 2.7, and 2.10 count towards UE reading and/or writing requirements.

An endorsement is able to be achieved in this course.

NCEA Level 2 English – Internal English (211)

This course has a practical focus, completing standards which will provide the students with reading, writing and presentation skills. This course does not lead on to Level 3 English. It is intended that this will be the final year of English studies for the students in this course.

This is an alternative course, designed for the student who achieved less than 14 credits at level 1 English. It caters for those who struggle with examinations.

IT IS MADE UP ENTIRELY OF INTERNAL STANDARDS. THERE ARE NO EXAMINATIONS

Students in this course will be on individual programmes, based on the number of credits they already have at Level 1 or Level 2, and the standards that they have already passed.
