NCEA Geography 201

Course information:

Geo 201 is an intermediate geography course, with a special focus on tropical rainforests, New Zealand's Tongariro National Park, and issues associated with city life. You will learn:

- How the processes that shape natural and cultural environments change over time, vary in scale and from place to place, and create spatial patterns
- How people's perceptions of and interactions with natural and cultural environments differ and have changed over time.

Total number of credits available:

External – 4 credits (additional 4 optional)

Internal – 14 credits

To gain a course endorsement in Level 2 geography, you need 14 or more credits at Merit or Excellence, and at least 3 of these credits from externally assessed standards and 3 credits from internally assessed standards.

Most geography standards count toward your literacy requirements for this year level.
