History and Classical Studies 301

The Course consists of an in depth study of Social Change It includes some of aspects Nineteenth Century New Zealand History: Votes for Women and The Treaty of Waitangi. This is an era of increasing debate, research and interest in New Zealand, and provides students with an insight into the past of their own society and the ideas of historians who study this. A major part of this year is the independent research project and work based on this. Students can pick their own topics. If you complete the history course, you can do some Classical studies internal standards or Pasifika research work.

THEMES

This year's course is based on one general theme of **Society and Change** including three minor themes Immigration to New Zealand , "Brave New World" looking at Nineteenth Century New Zealand Society and women's Votes and the Treaty of Waitangi. In your research assignments you will be able to look at wider world aspects of population and change including some modern topics.

Immigration to New Zealand and Maori –Pakeha Relations

- The Treaty of Waitangi, it's impact and differing attitudes to it 1840 -1900
- 1845 – 1900 Musket wars, Laws, Land
- Political and Religious Movements
- NZ Wars

Society and Attitudes in 19th Century New Zealand :

- Social Development, migration and demographic change, Vogel
- Issues such as work, gender, welfare. How attitudes towards men and women were formed from the colonial experience. Nz first to give women the vote

(Other topics may be studied as interest demands)
